EURYLOPHELLA TEMPORALIS (EPHEMEROPTERA: EPHEMERELLIDAE), A CASE OF SYNONYMY

While I was restudying my specimens of Eurylophella trilineata (Berner 1946) in preparation for a revision of my out-of-date monograph, "The Mayflies of Florida" (Berner 1950), I became convinced more than ever that the species is synonymous with E. temporalis (McDunnough 1924). Further, as I compared the Florida forms with northern temporalis which I had collected in Minnesota, I concluded that I was dealing with a single species. My southeastern specimens of E. doris (Traver 1934), I am now sure, are also E. temporalis. The 3 species, temporalis, doris, and trilineata, were distinguished on the basis of rather trivial color differences which, in my opinion, are not sufficiently distinctive to warrant specific rank.

When Traver described *E. doris*, she mentioned that she had specimens from the Withlacoochee River in Georgia. As the river is a tributary of the Suwannee and joins it in northern Florida, the same region from which *trilineata* was described, it is obvious that I was in error in believing that my specimens represented a new species.

Allen and Edmunds (1963) had virtually reached the conclusion that the 3 species are synonymous but they refrained from taking the action of assigning a single name until additional material was available for study. I now take that action in equating the names Eurylophella doris (Traver) and E. trilineata (Berner) with E. temporalis (McDunnough).
