

A CHECKLIST OF THE BURROWING MAYFLY FAMILY EPHEMERIDAE

Abstract

A checklist of the Ephemeridae is provided including 96 species, 7 genera and two subfamilies (Ephemerinae: *Ephemera* Linnaeus and *Afromera* Demoulin; Hexageniinae: *Denina* McCafferty, *Hexagenia* Walsh, *Litobrancha* McCafferty, *Eatonigenia* Ulmer and *Eatonica* Navas). Original and selected secondary reference sources and distributions are provided.

Key words: Ephemeroptera; Ephemeridae; Ephemerinae; Hexageniinae; checklist.

Introduction

The burrowing mayfly family Ephemeridae is nearly cosmopolitan in distribution being absent only in Australia and the oceanic islands. They inhabit fine substrates such as gravel, sand, silt, or mud in lotic and lentic habitats. The family presently includes 96 species in 7 genera and two subfamilies (Ephemerinae: *Ephemera* Linnaeus and *Afromera* Demoulin; Hexageniinae: *Denina* McCafferty, *Hexagenia* Walsh, *Litobrancha* McCafferty, *Eatonigenia* Ulmer and *Eatonica* Navas) (McCafferty, 2004).

The largest subfamily Ephemerinae includes *Ephemera* and *Afromera*, each of which includes 68 and seven species, respectively. The largest portion of *Ephemera* species (34 spp.) is known in Southeast Asia with a majority (30 spp.) recorded in Southern China. The Ephemeridae and related burrowing mayfly families were studied mainly by McCafferty (McCafferty 1973, 1991, McCafferty and Gilles 1979). The generic and familial catalogs of Ephemeridae were provided by McCafferty (1973, 1991, 2004), Hubbard (1978, 1990), McCafferty and Gilles (1979), etc. and the classification follows a recent phylogenetic classification by McCafferty (2004).

Although members of the family have been studied relatively frequently due to large body size, common occurrence and ecological importance in freshwater habitats, the species taxonomy and generic revisions are still needed in particular on the species groups in the Oriental Region. In the present paper, we provide an up-to-date checklist of the species and higher taxa of Ephemeridae with their original and

selected secondary reference sources and known distributional data for further revisionary studies of the family.
