A List of the Mayflies of Iowa

(Ephemeroptera)

DURING the past three years, the author has been engaged in a study of the mayflies of the state of Iowa. Although this area has a great variety of natural waters offering excellent and interesting collecting, little attention has been given to the species of this order occurring within the state. Indeed, the only records, up to the present time, have been scattered throughout the literature of the order. The purpose of this paper, therefore, is to correlate the work of previous authors and to add new data on various species.

The classification used in this report is, in general, that of Edmunds and Traver (1954) for the suprageneric nomenclature and that of Burks (1953) for the generic and specific nomenclature. In addition, most determinations have been compared with those of Dr. B. D. Burks, whose material is housed in the collections of the Illinois Natural History Survey.

The symbol M denotes that the specimen is in the collection of the Davenport Public Museum, Davenport, Iowa, while P denotes that it is in the personal collection of the author. All specimens were collected by the author.



Rhithrogena sp.

This is the first time that this genus has been recorded for the state. It is not possible to determine the specimens to species because our knowledge of the nymphs of the genus is incomplete.

Anepeorus simplex (Walsh)

As it is impossible at the present time to classify the females of this genus to species, the only value of the above records is the fact that they extend the range of this genus over a much greater area of the state.

Centroptilum walshi McDunnough

Again, as the nymphs of this genus cannot be classified to species level as yet, the only value of this record lies in the extension of the range of this genus to the middle of the state.

Baetis sp.

Although the nymphs of this genus are known somewhat better than average, still, many important gaps occur. For this reason, the author prefers not to classify the specimens to species until adult material can be definitely associated with them.

Superfamily CAENOIDEA Family Caenidae

The nymphs of this genus cannot be classified to species level; this data, however, extends the range of the genus within the state to the eastern edge.

Hexagenia limbata (Serville)

(Spieth 1941:249 intergrade of limbata-venusta); McCausland, June 8, 1955, 1 & (M); Muscatine, July 21, 1955, 1 & (M); Pleasant Valley, June 27, 1955, 1 nymph, from the Mississippi River (M); Spirit Lake, Aug. 6, 1955, adults (M&P).

Although Spieth (1941) has recorded intergrades between *H. limbata* and *H. venusta* for Iowa, I have counted *H. limbata* as new to the state as this is the first time it has been recorded as a typical species.

This genus is new to the state.

SUMMARY

The above data may be summarized as follows:

- A. Fifteen genera are recorded for the state; two of these are listed as new to the area.
- B. Thirty-three species are listed herein; seven of these are reported as new to the state and four others are related to exact localities (instead of merely Iowa) for the first time.
- C. Various extensions of range for different species are noted.
- D. All previous records of mayflies taken in Iowa are given.
